- Higher demand to owner surrender
- Families choosing to not reclaim their pets

 - Strategic Plan results April 2023



Clinic Improvement

- Increase ACS clinic staffing
 - Follow shelter medicine best practice
 - Meet the needs of 5,600 injured pets that arrive on ACS campus
 - Total of 9 new positions to adequately staff this team
 - Total cost is \$374,000










Customer Service Enhancement

- New Customer Service Team
 - Focus on providing real-time response to resident questions
 - Allow operations staff to focus directly on life-saving programs
 - Total of 5 positions
 - Total cost is \$245,000



Free Community Clinics

- Continue & increase (free) community pet microchip and vaccination events
 - Extend partnership with Animal Defense League
 - 2,400 pets annually
 - Total cost is \$42,000










Facility Improvements

- New Veterinary Hospital: \$17.3M
 - 2022 Bond
 - New state of the art hospital to expand ACS facilities
- Improved play yards for adoption meet & greets
 - Total cost is \$228,000
 - Renovates existing play yards and adds four play yards
- ACS Support Housing Building
 - Total cost is \$1.2M
 - New building for pets that have placement but waiting for homes



Community Animal Support & Assistance Team

- Community Animal Support & Assistance Team (CASA)
 - 5-member team
 - Reduce recidivism
 - Prevent owner surrenders
 - Provide residents education on humane pet care



Spay/Neuter Focused

- Increase Spay/Neuter opportunities
 - Working with private practices, non profit groups and conducting nationwide outreach to bring more opportunities to San Antonio
- \$1.2 Million for free Community Spay/Neuter
- Incorporated into the 2023
 Strategic Plan
