Comparative Analysis Planning Worksheet

Reminder: For this paper assignment, you will be arguing for a greater understanding or realization that comes from putting the two *Globalization* essays in conversation with each another. Each text on its own would not lead to this understanding; only through the engagement of *both* texts can you achieve this important insight. *Note: Unlike Paper 1 which asked you to closely analyze how effectively the author achieved his or her purpose in the essay, Paper 2 is asking you to argue for your own greater understanding as a result of reading these two texts together.

A. Which two essays do you plan to analyze for Paper 2? Provide author's full name and the title of the essay in quotation marks. (<i>This should be included in part 1 of your intro</i>)

Following the guidelines and sample questions #1-4, come up with your own tentative question/problem that you wish to explore in your paper through the analysis of both texts (<i>This will serve as part 2 of your intro</i>):
E. Why does this issue (in "C" above) matter? How can exploring this issue benefit your reader and/or what is at stake (what does your reader stand to lose) by not exploring the issue further? (This will be your "So what?" response, which should come somewhere in your transition from part 2 to part 3 of your intro)?
F. Your question should lead you to an argumentative response (your <i>claim</i>), which will be your argument for your own greater understanding about the primary theme(s) under analysis as a result of your careful analysis of specific elements of the two <i>Globalization</i> essays. What is your response to the question in "C" above? In other words, what is your own position and greater understanding of this issue? <i>(This will serve as part 3 of your intro)</i>

G. What specific elements of <u>each Globalization essay</u> do you plan to analyze to help you develop and support your claim? (These will serve as your topics and points of analysis in your main body paragraphs)
