D = Dispatch

- Unit responding on
- Unit(s) responding with
- Mode of response
- Location
- Nature of call

A = Arrival

- What does the scene look like?
- Where is the patient located?
- Is the patient ambulatory?

C = Chief Complaint

- What the patient/family member/care states is the current problem
- If no information available or cannot be communicated, utilize diagnostic skills to determine

H = History

- Both PMH and HPI
- Utilize mnemonics such as:
 - SAMPLE
 - OPQRST
 - AEIOUTIPS
- Any statement the patient or spokesperson makes about the current event and past pertinent events

A = Assessment

- Primary and secondary
- Include pertinent negatives
- Results of any diagnostic equipment

R = Treatment on scene

- Any treatment and/or intervention provided on scene
- Who and when for each intervention, along with patient response
- Time, dosage, and route for any medication

T = Transport

- Destination and mode (code 2 or 3)
- All treatments and intervention in the same manner as on scene
- Any Changes in patient condition
- To whom and where you released the patient

E = Exceptions

- Any issues during response, on scene, transport or arrival
- Documentation area for patient refusal
